



# Personal Safety and Consideration of Others

## **SITE ACCESS**

The festival site is considered a secure site, meaning everyone must sign in and out with security.

All participants are to stay within the bounds of the Festival site.

The camp is a secure site and only persons with the correct wristband or pass will be allowed on site.

Adults, including KIST and Participant Leaders can leave site, however they **MUST** sign out with the security at the gate.

## **WRISTBANDS**

Wristbands and passes must always be clear and visible during the camp.


Please note that all wristbands have an ID number and are unique to everyone. They carry with them specific medial and activity information. On arrival you will be issued a list of which ID number is for what person within your group. If you sport any issues with them, please contact the Admin Team at the soonest opportunity.

When putting wristbands on please ensure that they are done up tight enough to not come off, but not too tight to be uncomfortable. A good guide to putting them on is putting two fingers under the band when tightening.

Any deliberate misuse or damage to wristbands may lead to a charge for a replacement, these are available from the Information Centre.

## QUIET TIMES

Out of respect for your fellow campers, please keep noise to a minimum between 23.00 and 06.00 hours. During this time, we ask that all radios and portable speakers are switched off.

## BEHAVIOUR

### General

Having fun at camp is what our festival is all about. However, the enjoyment of those attending must not be compromised by other people misbehaving. Respect and consideration towards others and their property must be observed at all times. Inappropriate behaviour towards other campers or staff will not be tolerated.

The Camp Organisers will act against any individual or group indulging in inappropriate behaviour during the camp.

Any persons caught stealing and/or vandalising will be dealt with and in accordance with POR and Festival policies; this will likely lead to being removed from site.

### Alcohol

Alcohol is only allowed to be consumed by adults aged 18 or over in designated areas in the Urban Hub (including the Crooked Staff).

Consumption of alcohol anywhere else on site for the duration of the camp is strictly prohibited.

Leaders remain responsible for the young people within their care.

If you are unsure, please consult The Scouts Associations "Green Card" - Scouting and alcohol.

### Drugs

Leaders must be aware of any prescription drugs needed by participants and any possible side-effects. Possession & consumption of illegal drugs at the festival will result in expulsion from the event for any individual concerned.
